to provide for the authorization of appropriation moneys out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Manipur to meet the amounts spent on certain services during the financial year ended on the 31st day of March, 2016 in excess of the amounts as granted for those services and for that year.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Manipur in the seventieth year of the Republic of India as follows:-

From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Manipur, the sums specified in column 3 of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sum of one hundred fortythree crore fifty-nine lakh eightyone thousand only shall be deemed to have been authorized to be paid and applied to meet the amount spent for defraying the charges in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule during the financial year ended on the 31 st day of March, 2016 in excess of the amounts granted for those services and for that year. | Issue of Rupees 143,59,81,000/- from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Manipur to meet certain excess expenditure for the financial year ended on the 31 st March, 2016. |

**MEMORANDUM SHOWING FINANCIAL IMPLICATION OF THE
MANIPUR APPROPRIATION (No. 5) BILL, 2019**

The Manipur Appropriation (No. 5) Bill, 2019 makes provisions for appropriation of a sum of Rs. 143,59,81,000/- (Rupees one hundred fortythree crore fiftynine lakh eightyone thousand only) from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Manipur to meet certain excess expenditure for the year ended on the 31st March, 2016. The various services and purposes for which the amount is sought to be appropriated have been shown in the Schedule to the Bill. The Public Accounts Committee has, in their Fiftieth Report recommended regularization of the excess expenditure amounting to Rs. 143,59,81,000/-.
